#### Maine 2012 Expenditures

## **New Market Tax Credits**

- Goal: to spur economic development in impoverished and low income neighborhoods
- credit equals 39% of the investment paid out (5% in each of the first three years, then 6% in the final four years, for a total of 39%) over seven years



- Very large projects
- Greater than \$10,000,000
- Earmark funds for economic development initiatives
- CEI Capital Management

#### **Historic Preservation Tax Credits - Federal**



- Certified historic structures are eligible for a credit equal to 20 percent of the cost of rehabilitation
- Properties built before 1936 that are not eligible for individual listing on the National Register of Historic Places, nor eligible for inclusion in a certified historic district are eligible for a credit equal to 10 percent of the cost of rehabilitation

#### Historic Preservation Tax Credits - State

Substantial Rehabilitation Credit: A 25% state credit for any rehabilitation that also qualifies for the 20% federal credit.



Small Project Rehabilitation Credit: A 25% state credit for the rehabilitation of certified historic structures with certified qualified rehabilitation expenditures of between \$50,000 and \$250,000

Affordable Housing Rehabilitation Credit Increase: The State Substantial Rehabilitation Credit and the Small Project Rehabilitation Credit may be increased to 30% if the rehabilitation project results in the creation of a certain amount of affordable housing.
